Realizing a need, filling that need

Gov. Eddie Baza Calvo today signed the qualifying certificate for the Guam Regional Medical City at a ceremony held at the Ricardo J. Bordallo Governor’s Complex, Adelup.

The governor thanked Pete Sgro, who started the process of bringing a private hospital to Guam to help fill the medical needs of Guamanians, including specialty care that isn’t currently available on island. The governor also thanked the GRMC leadership and their team of doctors, nurses and staff for wanting to make a difference in the community.

Mana Silva Taijeron, Guam Economic Development Authority deputy administrator, said the purpose of the Qualifying Certificate Program is to increase jobs.

“Not only does the new hospital bring medical services to the island it also supports the Qualifying Certificate Program. What the hospital also is doing is providing jobs for our people, and that benefits the entire community because of the positive impact to our economy.”
